

SGBV

This 2-week training is designed to increase effectiveness of International Police Officers participating in the AU and UN Mission in Darfur. In support of the UNAMID Mandate for UNPOL, this course aims to strengthen the capacity of UNPOL officers who work with Government of Sudan Police on sexual and gender based violence (SGBV) in Darfur.

Applying principles of Adult Learning, participants will work through activities to enhance their skills in interviewing victims, witnesses and suspects as well as implementation plans for the awareness and the prevention of SGBV. Throughout the course, participants will practice and reinforce report writing skills, community policing problem-solving techniques and working with local and international actors in ensuring proper follow-up and access to resources for victims and suspects. Participants will further develop effective mentoring and training competencies which can be applied to support the Government of the Sudan Police in Darfur.

To facilitate a PPC course, the ideal candidate will have:

- A strong operational background in policing
 - Recent peace operations mission experience (2002-2008)
 - Good interpersonal skills, team player – interacts with others in a sensitive and respectful manner
 - A background in cultural awareness and sensitivity
 - A training background with experience in program facilitation
 - An ability to communicate (orally and written) in a clear and concise manner
 - An ability to work long hours in less than desirable conditions
 - Ability to analyze, plan and organize, evaluate and implement actions to meet goals and objectives in a changing environment
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- Formal education in adult learning/education an asset
 - Bilingualism an asset (French and English)
